

SUMMARY ANNUAL REPORT
FOR SEATTLE PACIFIC UNIVERSITY HEALTH & WELFARE PLAN

This is a summary of the annual report of the Seattle Pacific University Health & Welfare Plan, EIN 91-0565553, Plan No. 507, for period July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2011. The annual report has been filed with the Employee Benefits Security Administration, U.S. Department of Labor, as required under the Employee Retirement Income Security Act of 1974 (ERISA).

Seattle Pacific University has committed itself to pay all claims incurred under the terms of the plan.

Insurance Information

The plan has contracts with Sun Life Assurance Company of Canada, Standard Insurance Company and Vision Service Plan to pay Stop Loss, Life Insurance, Accidental Death & Dismemberment, Long-Term Disability, and Vision claims incurred under the terms of the plan. The total premiums paid for the plan year ending June 30, 2011 were \$596,566.

Because the Standard Insurance Company and Vision Service Plans are so called experience-rated contracts, the premium costs are affected by, among other things, the number and size of claims. Of the total insurance premiums paid for the plan year ending June 30, 2011, the premiums paid under such experience-rated contracts were \$329,920 and the total of all benefit claims paid under these experience-rated contracts during the plan year was \$228,077.
