



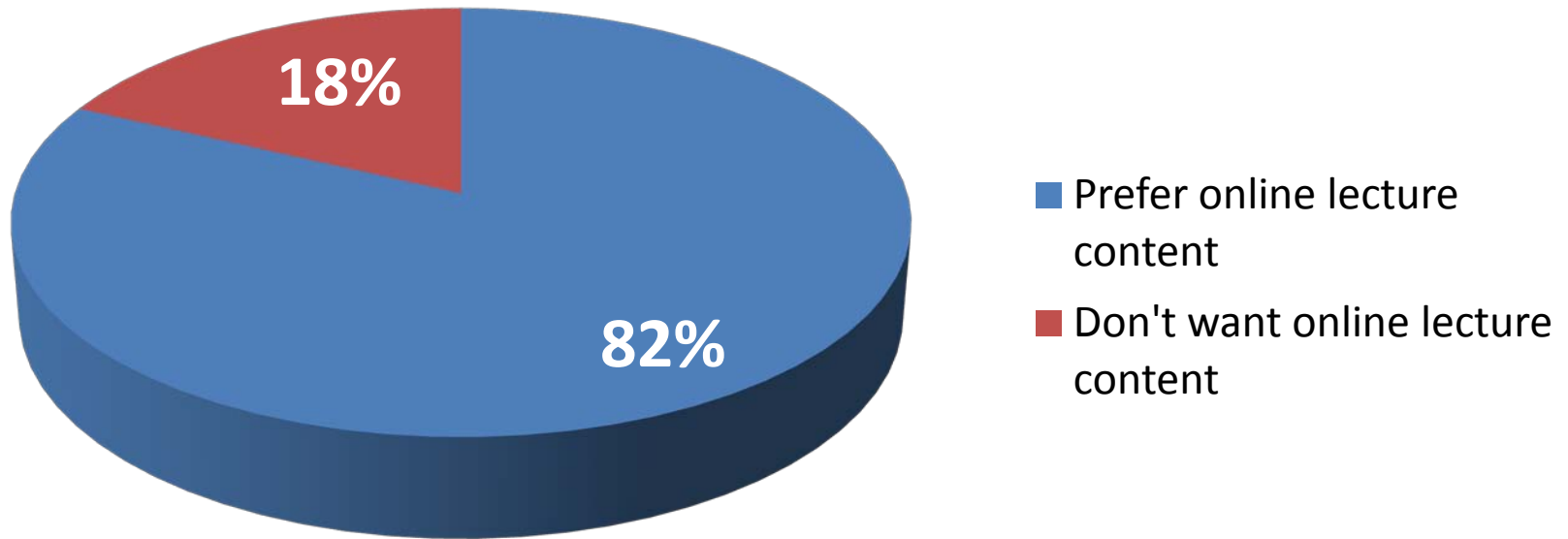
Lecture Capture Technologies: Using Camtasia Relay to Create Screencasts

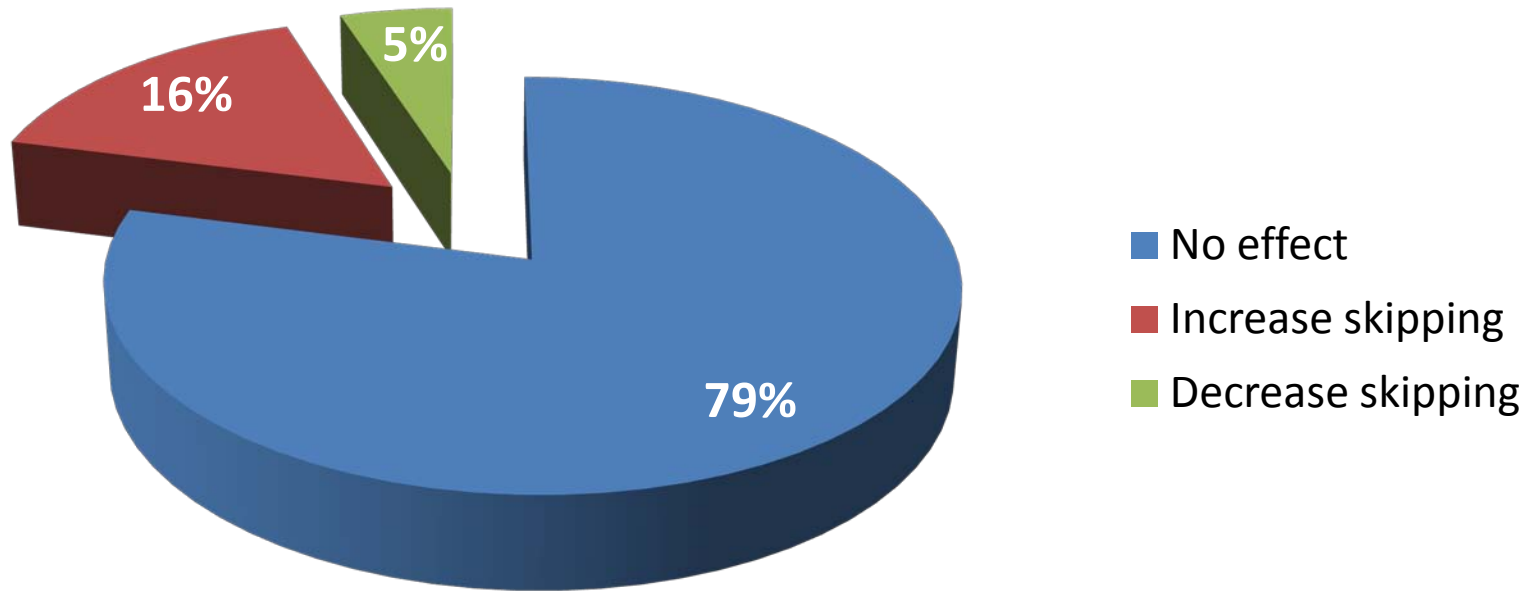
- Learn about research in support of lecture capture technology.

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

Camtasia Relay Workflow



What is a Profile & why should I care?



Basic Tips

Standardize on settings when recording a series of podcasts

Recordings don't have to be perfect but it's okay to try again

Have patience - Efficiency comes with practice

Eliminate Desktop distractions

Consider mouse modifications to help students know what you want them to look at on the screen

Narration Tips

Consider writing a script

Practice a recording several times

Include goals or objectives near the beginning

Try to eliminate exterior noise when recording

Speak slowly, take your time

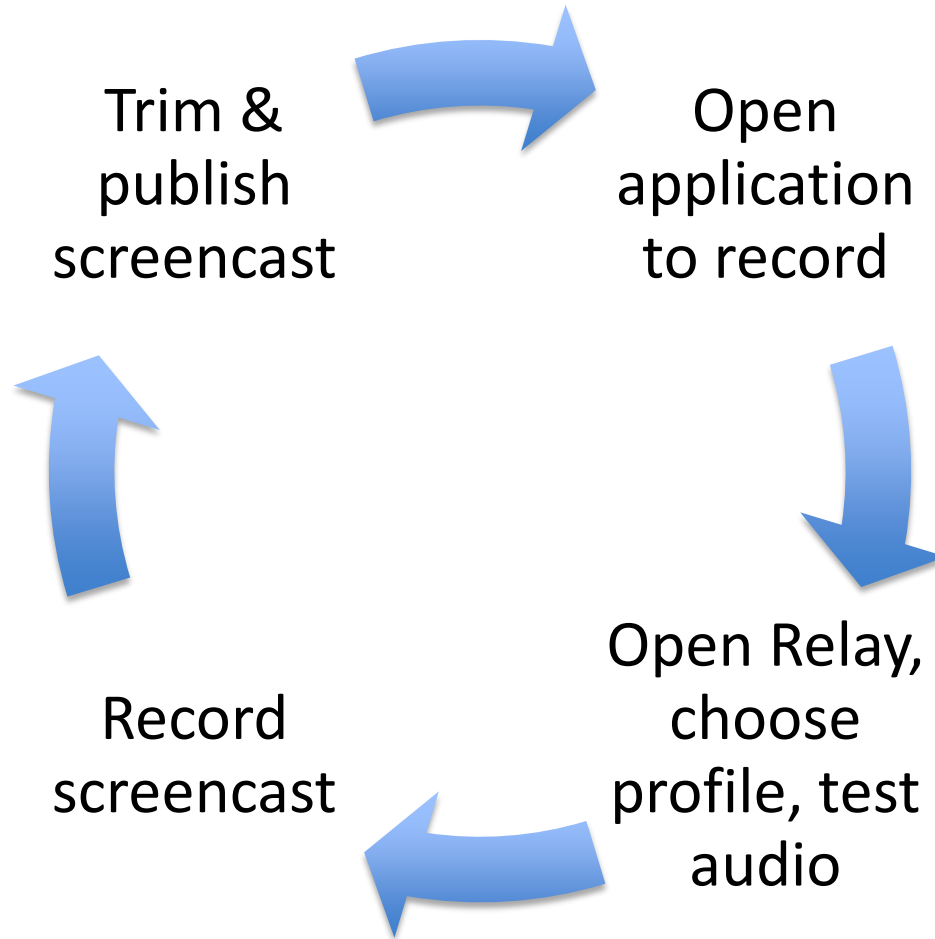
