If you select the MA(CSt) degree, you will combine a core study of general theology with specialized study in Christian Studies.

As a Master of Arts (Christian Studies) student, you will develop the knowledge, skills, and multicultural sensitivities you need to understand the Christian faith and put it into faithful and effective practice in a hurting world. You will also experience rich opportunities for worship, fellowship, and personal spiritual growth in the context of SPU's evangelical Wesleyan heritage.
