Employer Spotlight

Anthony Rivisto: King County Life Director

Why do you like to hire college students?

I love the *enthusiasm* and willingness to learn that *college students* have. For the students who have studies that line up with the work we do in the community, it is a great component to *deepen their learning* experience while hearing and growing from the lives of the youth we work with through City Life.



Did you work when you were in college or high school? What was that like?

I did. I had a work-study position at the Wallingford Boys & Girls Club. I loved it. I would go to the after-school program that they had throughout the week, help with homework, snack and fun activities. It was a lot of fun and I was really amazed at all that goes into youth serving organizations!



City Life Ministry Program:

City Life focuses on serving kids in tough places where they live, their neighborhoods and schools. We run after school programs and drop-in centers near the schools so that we can *minister* to kids academically, socially and spiritually.

City Life leaders share the hope of Jesus through intentional discipleship. By strategically developing young leaders within a neighborhood, those students are then given opportunities to give back to their own community and disciple others. This "indigenous" leadership model puts young leaders back into their own communities, building them up from the inside, and inspires the next generation who comes after them to also reach their full potential in Christ.

Do you have any advice for students who are looking for a job, or are thinking about looking?

1) Ask yourself what your *interests* are and what makes you come *alive* and then find a position that runs in line with that. OR 2) think about a skill that you will need for your *future* (book keeping, customer service, counseling, etc) and find a position that will enable you to build your ability in that *skill set*.

Opportunities at Youth for Christ:

Seattle Youth for Christ is hiring YFC Interns to serve at our sites across King County. The internship offers a *quarterly scholarship* ranging from \$1200-\$1800 per quarter for SPU students. Interns help as tutors, small group facilitators, game runners, bible study leaders, supportive listeners, and mentors. With the sites we have across King County, many of our *interns participate* in winter and summer camps, which are memorable and *impactful* times for youth and leaders.
