As you know, it is now time to complete your 2016-2017 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)! Just a couple of things to know:

- You must file no later than June 1, 2016 for priority consideration.
- If you participated in a work study program during 2015, you received an email on 02/04/16 from Danielle Richmond.
- Put the amount in this email under taxable earnings from need-based employment programs on the FAFSA. Your total earnings can be found in Banner (Home > Employee Main Menu > Employee Pay and Account Menu > View Earnings Summary).
