Notes

This "model" tracking sheet lists the courses needed to complete both the Master of Divinity degree at Seattle Pacific Seminary and the Master of Science in Marriage and Family Therapy in the SPU School of Psychology, Family and Community. The quarters, days of the week and times of day that specific courses are offered may, however, vary from year to year. Moreover, students may elect to take a different credit load quarter by quarter than is shown here. Also, students must be accepted into each program separately, and may in some cases begin the second program a year or more later than the first. Accordingly, the actual sequence in which a given student takes the required courses for the two degrees, and the actual "calendar time" it takes that student to complete those two degrees, may vary considerably from this model.

The MDiv degree requires 120 quarter credits of course work. The MDiv normally requires:

Core courses	39 cr.
Basic courses	51 cr.
Post-core Scripture courses	6 cr.
Interdisciplinary courses	6 cr.
Elective courses	<u> 18 cr.</u>
Total	120 cr.

The MS-MFT requires 70 credits of coursework.

But in the dual-degree configuration shown here, a student can complete both degrees by taking, not a minimum of 190 credits of coursework, but as few as 158. Here's how it works:

- 6 of the required 12 credits of THEO 6940/6941 Contextual Education required for the MDiv can be fulfilled by MFT Clinical Practicum courses
- 24 of the required credits of interdisciplinary and elective courses for the MDiv can be fulfilled by MFT courses.
- 2 MFT elective credits can be fulfilled by a required 3-credit MDiv course (THEO 6743).

By double-counting 32 credits of courses, a student enrolled in the dual degree program can thus realize a savings of between two and three quarters of full-time coursework and about \$15,000 in tuition payments.
