He has been the Director of Percussion Studies at Seattle Pacific University since 1988, served two years as District Music Supervisor for the Rainier School District and has been a special percussion consultant to the Olympia School District since 1978.

He has performed with the Seattle Gilbert and Sullivan Society, the Ashi Opera of Japan, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Allegro Dance Series, Seattle Pro Musica, and most recently served as principal timpanist with the Tacoma City Ballet. His musical theater credits include the Tacoma Actors Guild, Washington Center for the Performing Arts, the Village Theater, Renton Civic Theater and Seattle Prep. He has opened for such artists as Johnny Cash, Ricky Skaggs, Albert Collins, Pam Tillis, Delbert McClinton, and Etta James. Some of his recording credits include The Diamonds, Ventures guitarist Nokie Edwards, Greg Adams of Tower of Power, and Gene Nygaard, He has been the featured percussionist with Lukas Nelson and Promise of the Real and on Stephanie Porter's latest CD "Radio Theater." Dan recently created and performed the percussion score for the new musical "Abraham's Land" about the Palestinian Israeli conflict.

Dan Kramlich has established himself as one of Seattle's most sought after performers, educators, and adjudicators. His style was informed by jazz legends Fred Hersch and Billy Hart, with whom he worked extensively while studying at Western Michigan University.
