This is a sample schedule of sequencing for the Journalism Major. There is a bit of flexibility in class placement in your first 2 years as you navigate through the University's Common and Exploratory Curriculum, and Journalism Core. Watch years 3 and 4 closely for courses that are offered only every-other year.
