## Other requirements for the degree

In addition to the major, the degree requires completion of any remaining general education and University requirements, and at least 180 college-level credits total, including 60 upperdivision (UD) credits.

All students must complete the University Foundations requirement at SPU – even those who have completed the Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) Associate Degree.
