

TIMELINE

PRE-APPLICATION

- Know the requirements of different schools
 - Different classes, volunteer hours, recommendations, etc.
 - Ex. UWSOD 50 hours shadowing and 50 hours volunteer work
- Write down everything you do
 - Volunteer hours (DO IT!)
 - Awards
 - Organizations
 - Shadowing hours
 - Manual Dexterity

PRE-APPLICATION CONT.

- Sign up to take the DAT
 - Be realistic with your study methods and test date
- Start thinking about who to ask for letter's of recommendation now
- Don't be afraid to be different...it's a good thing!

DAT Testing Schedule	
Optional tutorial	15 minutes
Survey of Natural Sciences	90 minutes
Perceptual Ability Test	60 minutes
Scheduled Break (optional)	15 minutes
Reading Comprehension	60 minutes
Quantitative Reasoning	45 minutes
Optional Post Test Survey	15 minutes
Total Time	5 hours

SUBMITTING YOUR APPLICATION

DENTAL SCHOOL APPLICATION

- https://portal.aadsasweb.org/
- Check when application portal opens
 - Usually early June
- Have everything together and readily available
- Main components:
 - Personal Statement
 - Letters of Recommendation (ask in early March)
 - Describing activities, volunteering, etc.
 - Inputting classes and grades
 - Sending official transcript

APPLICATION CONT.

- Think through where exactly you want to apply
 - The more schools the more money!
- Supplemental Applications
 - Some school do and some don't
 - Many require additional fees
- If you don't hear from the school you want, call them!



INTERVIEWS

- Different schools have different formats
 - 2-3 half hour interviews, "tell me about yourself..."
 - Multiple mini interviews (MMI) format
 - UWSOD
 - 8-12 8minutes interviews/activities
- Be polite and shake everyone's hand!
- Take time to prepare
 - Study the school
 - Why do you want to go there?
 - What are your values, ethics, goals, triumphs, downfalls, etc
