This residency will help you launch your career and gain the knowledge, skills and confidence to navigate the complexity of the healthcare setting.



Program Expectations

The program is a twelve month formal, structured program for post-baccalaureate and associate degree nurses and is part of the Vizient/AACN Nurse Residency Program model. Each resident will participate in a combination of clinical and monthly education sessions.

- Commitment to participate in the year long program.
- Complete all classroom sessions and program surveys or evaluations.
- Practice professionalism and participate in Skagit Regional Health's mission and guiding principles.
- Commitment to the organization for 2 years.

Application Criteria

To be considered for the Skagit Regional Health Nurse Residency Program, you will need to meet the following criteria:

- Graduation from an accredited nursing program before program start date.
- Less than six months experience.
- Licensed in the state of Washington as a RN before program start date.
