Child and Adolescent Laboratory

The Child and Adolescent Lab, directed by Jenny Vaydich and located within the School of Psychology, Family, and Community at Seattle Pacific University, explores the influence of parent-child relationships and interactions on child and adolescent emotion regulation development. We are particularly interested in parent-child relationships and parental emotion socialization during childhood and adolescence. Previous projects have focused on aggression; however, more recent projects have examined the influence of parent-child relationships on symptoms of depression and anxiety.

The following are the broad research areas that Dr. Vaydich and her research team study:

- Child and adolescent emotion regulation
- Parental emotion socialization
- Attachment
- Parent-adolescent conflict
- Neuroendocrine responses to stress within parent-child relationships

Current projects are exploring the following areas:

- The influence of parent-adolescent conflict on adolescent mental and physical health
- The relationship between parental criticism and adolescent depressive symptoms
- Parental attachment relationships and disordered eating during late adolescence
- The impact of early parenting experiences on adolescent emotional functioning
