^{*}LD=Lower-division: the course transfers as a lower-division equivalent to the SPU course. These courses may be completed at SPU rather than at North Seattle without adding time to the degree.

Note: Only courses with a grade of 1.7 (C-) or higher may count toward a major or minor.

Direct Admission to the Major upon Admission to the University

Only about 10% of high achieving transfer students are admitted through direct admission each year. Most transfer students successfully go through the regular admission process after transferring (see section below). Transfer Direct Admission requires that you meet all of the criteria below:

- Completion of 90 college-level credits or approved DTA associate degree
- Minimum cumulative college-level GPA of 3.0 in both general coursework and prerequisites
- Completion of at least 2 lower division core courses in the major

Regular Admission to the Major after Transfer

Students are admitted to the major annually, during winter quarter. Autumn quarter admits not directly admitted to the Business Administration major can still apply in their first year at SPU. Winter and spring admits apply the following year. Students admitted annually is limited by capacity. To be considered you must have:

- Sophomore standing (45 credits)
- At least 15 credits in BUS, ACCT, and ECN courses at SPU (10 credits if you transfer with 90+ credits)
- 2.70 major GPA at SPU and 2.70 cumulative GPA; or a 3.0 major GPA at SPU.

completion of any remaining general education and University requirements, and at least 180 college credits total, including 60 upper-division (UD) credits.

University Foundations Requirements

All students must complete the University Foundations Requirement at SPU—even those who have completed the Direct Transfer Agreement (DTA) Associate Degree.

Students admitted with fewer than 90 credits (freshmen and sophomores) complete 15 credits: UFDN 1000 The Christian Faith (5) UFDN 2000 Christian Scriptures (5) UFDN 3100 Christian Theology (5)

Students admitted with 90 credits or more (juniors and seniors) complete 10 credits: UFDN 3001 Christian Scriptures (5) UFDN 3100 Christian Theology (5)

Suggested course plan for your junior and senior years at SPU

Assumes junior standing at entrance and satisfactory completion of these courses prior to transfer: ECON& 201, ECON& 202, ACCT& 201, ACCT& 202, ACCT& 203, ACCT 251, ACCT 255, ACCT 270, BUS& 201, and MATH& 146 or BUS 210. Time to degree might be extended if courses are not yet complete.
