

### What can you do with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Psychology from SPU?

The BA in Psychology at Seattle Pacific University provides an excellent background for employment in work where interpersonal understanding and skills are needed. It also prepares you for additional studies in areas such as counseling, teaching, medicine, pastoral ministry, and law.

You will choose one of the following tracks in the major: Animal Behavior, Clinical-Counseling Psychology, Community Psychology & Behavioral Health, Data Analytics, Developmental Psychology, Psychological Science, Social-Personality Psychology, or Sports Psychology.

**Note:** Completion of these courses is not required for transfer, but may aid in timely completion of your degree. Only courses with a regular grade of 1.7 (C-) or higher may count toward a major or minor.

\*LD=Lower-division: the course transfers as a lower-division equivalent to the SPU course

## Courses in the major to complete at SPU

PSY 2360 Intro to Stats for Social & Behavioral Sci (5)
PSY 3588 Psychological Research Methods (5)
PSY 410X Advanced Research Methods (5)
PSY 3410 Cross-Cultural Psychology (5)
PSY 3700 Learning and Behavior (5) <b>-or-</b> PSY 3800 Cognitive Psychology (5)

PSY Electives (5 credits required)
In addition to the major, the degree requires completion of any remaining general education and University requirements, and at least 180 college-level credits total, including 60 upper-division (UD) credits.
